

For 17 years, UTA's TRAX light rail system has carried passengers through Salt Lake County. In 2016, the TRAX system provided more than 19.5 million rides across 45 miles and nine municipalities. TRAX service now runs on three lines with 50 stations and provides access to key business districts and residential areas.

About TRAX

TRAX has three lines: the Blue Line from Draper to downtown Salt Lake City, the Red Line from South Jordan to University of Utah, and the Green Line, which runs from West Valley City to the Salt Lake City International Airport.

Riding TRAX

The bus, TRAX and FrontRunner systems complement each other with many bus routes meeting light rail and commuter rail passengers at Park & Ride lots and other transfer points. TRAX operates between 5:30 a.m. and 11:30 p.m. seven days a week and is closed on select holidays.



Route information can be found online at rideuta.com or by calling 1-888-RIDE-UTA. Riders are expected to pay at a ticket vending machine prior to boarding, and transfers are good for up to two hours as part of the same trip. All UTA TRAX trains are fully accessible.
